

Unity

Unity is the presentation of a unified image. Unity implies that congruity or agreement exists among the elements of design another word is harmony

For example it is hard to unit a winter picture with a summer picture. So try and scrapbook with a theme this creates a unity. Organization of how you layout your photos can also create unity. When unity is working the whole of your page will look good as a unit. Visual unity is working the whole of your page will look good as a unit. Visual unity denotes some harmony or agreement between the items that is apparent to the eye.

Ways to achieve unity:

Make individual items look like they belong together, by putting them close together. Repeat shapes and colors and certain elements we create unity. Continuation naturally means something continues usually a line or and edge, or a direction from one from to another. The viewer's eye is carried by careful placement of just touching or continuous contour from on to the next.

You can achieve unity with variety elements by changing the size, color. This can spice up a page but it will still be united with the same type of objects.

Rhythm

Rhythm is a principle we associate with a sense of hearing. Music without words, intrigues us by its pulsating beat, inducing us to tap a foot or perhaps dance. Poetry often has a meter, which is another term for rhythm. The repetitive flow of objects can create rhythm. The idea of movement of the viewer's eye, a visual pattern that causes the eye to move quickly and easily from one element to another. Based on repetition of objects, color or textures.
